Here is what we are learning about next week:

- English – We are starting our new topic on pirates! We will be learning a story called ‘Pirate Plank’ which follows the life of a pirate over a week.
- Handwriting - numbers: 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9
- Phonics - Revising alternative spellings for /oa/ as in ‘oa’ in boat, ‘ow’ in snow, ‘oe’ in toe and ‘o_e’ in bone.
- Maths - Learning and applying positional and direction language to problems.
- DT - Researching, designing, making and evaluating healthy salads.

Design and Technology Week

This week we are having a DT week. Each afternoon we will be working on our healthy salad project.

Over the week will be doing research into the classes’ favourite fruit and vegetables. Learning how to prepare and taste testing a range of different fruit and vegetables. No Forest School

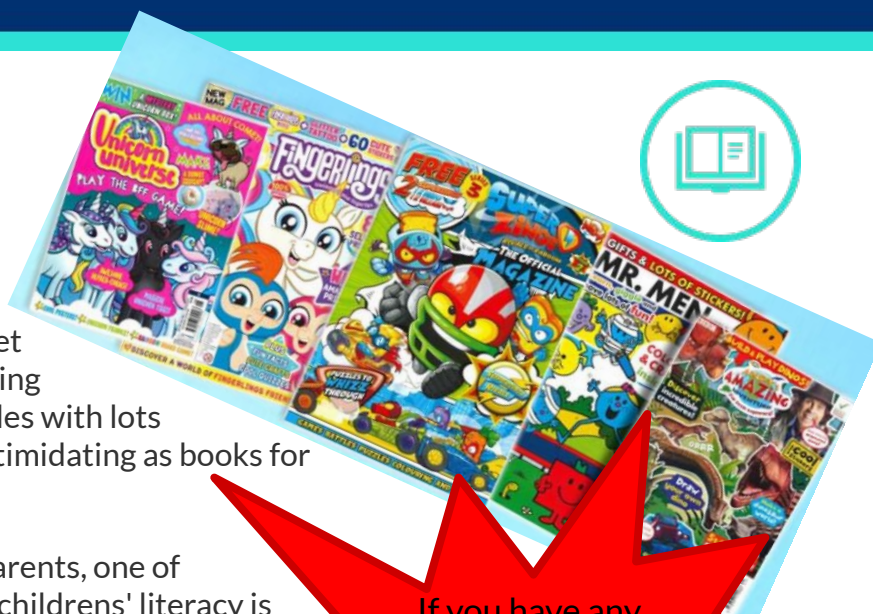
There will be no forest school for Year 1 on the first week back. This is because we will be working on our DT project.
