Reading at home



Reading is the most important academic skill we teach children. Without good reading, other learning is hampered. There is a strong indicator from research that if parents share in children's reading, then it makes a significant difference – e.g. parent and children take alternate turns reading a page. 'Echo reading' is an excellent strategy, where the parent reads a page aloud and then the child reads the exact same page trying their best to emulate that the parent has just modelled for them.

W.O.W—word of the week: 'pivot' (noun)

A rod or pin upon which another part rotates, swings, or moves back and forth.
