This week we are learning:

- **Maths:** The children will continue to use Base 10 to partition two digit numbers 11-20. We will be applying our counting skills to find one more and one less numbers 11-20. The children will begin to compare groups of objects and numbers up to 20 using key vocabulary of comparison '**greater than, less than and equal to**'.
- **English:** The children will continue to orally rehearse our story map of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We will be identifying words containing the '**ed**' suffix where no change is needed to the root word and applying this to our writing. The children will also be using and applying '**and**' to join to sentences together.
- **Geography:** We will be continuing our United Kingdom topic by looking at what is special about Wales and Northern Ireland.
- **History:** Look out for the new Knowledge Organiser coming home this week all about 'The Great Fire of London'. We will begin to sequence the events of The Great Fire of London.

Concept Cat:

We will be introducing a new concept to your child each week. We will model using the word as much as possible during the week. Can you use this word at home?
