Homework:

Mathematics: The homework this week is on dividing fractions. The children are expected to complete their homework for Monday. There is an example on the sheet of the methods we have practised in school.

Spellodrome: The children are expected to achieve 500 points weekly. In addition to this, they are expected to complete the look, say, cover, write and cover tasks in their homework diary.

Spelling bee:The Year Six spelling bee will be on next Monday (9/12). The children will be tested on 20 of the words from the list sent home. The children have had these words for several weeks now and should have been completing the look, say, cover, write and cover tasks in their homework diary using these words.

Reading: Children should continue to read at least three times per week; parents should denote all reading with a daily signature in your child's homework diary.

Some children also have additional comprehension sheet homework to help support their reading understanding.

Topic: There is no compulsory homework for topic. However, optional homework project can be completed at any point this half-term. Homework projects are due to be shared with the class on Friday 10th January. Furthermore, you could support your child's learning by reading, discussing and quizzing the content on the knowledge organiser.
