Attendance & Punctuality

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their children attend school and stay in school for every session that they have been registered.

The class teacher will take a register recording who is present and absent from school at 8.45am. Children arriving after 8.45am will be marked as late on the register. The gate opens at 8.25am and closes promptly at 8.45am.

Reasons for absence must be given by parents/carers. Please, contact the School Office, each day of absence.

Attendance rewards:

- Half-termly certificates are issued for all children with 100% attendance.
- A badge and prize are awarded to children with 100% attendance for a whole academic year. Children with 100% attendance in any term will receive a bronze pin badge award. Any child who has 100% attendance for two consecutive terms will receive a silver badge. 100% attendance for the year will merit a 100% badge as per above.

Communication Books/Wallet

- We use the books as a means of keeping in contact with parents, providing letters, targets and any homework.
 - We will check the communication books each morning IF your child has put it in the 'drop box'.
 - We expect the children to write a sentence in their books each week. All books will be checked on a Monday evening.
- Please ensure everything remains in the wallet and it is brought into school every day.

Reading Diaries

- 090
- This week, your child will begin bringing home reading books.
- 1 book will be the book they have read that week during their guided reading session (RWI) and another book will be one they have chosen from a colour coded band.
- We ask that you write the date and title in the Reading Diary every time your child reads at home - adding a comment when relevant.
- We have boxes located outside the classroom for the children to put their reading book bag into 'My book needs changing please'.

Assessment/ Targets

- You will notice in the front of the Communication Wallet there are target records for Writing, Key Words and Maths.
- We will update these targets towards the end of each term.
 - Your child must show us that they have met their target independently, in school.


Key Words


- Children have a pink 'Key words record' in their communication book.
- Children need to practice reading by sight and spelling the 7 sets of 'Common Exception Words'
- We test the children 1:1 at school to see whether they can read and spell the words confidently and consistently.
 - Children need to practice reading the 11 sets of 'High Frequency Words' by sight – after learning the C.E.W.


Phonics



- Phonics is taught daily to all of our children.
- We use parts of the scheme called 'Read, Write Inc'.
- This year, children will begin to be taught whole class and differentiation will follow according to their needs and phonic knowledge.
 - There will be a Phonic information meeting held later in the year.
 - In June 2020 there will be a National Phonic Screening for all Year One children across the country.







- We use a variety of concrete materials including: 'Numicon', 'Ten Frames', 'Base 10' as an aid for teaching maths.
- Children are encouraged to use it as a supporting tool throughout all maths sessions.
- They provide a practical approach which helps to support children's understanding of number.
- It also helps children to explain and practise new ideas through the use of concrete materials.
- Children will learn to reason mathematically and solve practical problems.

Sex and Relationships Education (SRE)

- Unit of work is taught in summer term.
- Covers the same topics as in Reception.
- We will invite you in to look at planning.
