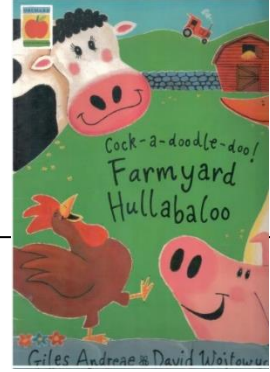




## Our Week Ahead

## Reading at home.

Some key tips for helping your child get the most from their reading books at home. Adults can ask questions to the child when reading together:

- The “**5 W’s**” – **W**ho? **W**hat? **W**here? **W**hen? And **W**hy? See the poster above.
- Use a mixture of closed questions (for example, did the character find the toy?) and open questions (for example, why do you think the character did that?).
- Ask children to summarise what has happened in the book up to a certain point.
- Ask children to predict what might happen next in the story.
- Make links to the child’s own experiences for example when reading about Cinderella going to a ball, you could compare this to being like a party such as a birthday party.
