Well Prepared for Life	
English	This half term children will be focusing on explanation texts, looking at the features which need to be included in this type of text. The writing will be based on 'How a dishwasher works' which they will learn as a WAGOLL. Our sentence work will focus on asking rhetorical questions to 'hook' the reader, as well as using a range of time openers and causal connectives.
Maths	Children will continue to reinforce mental and written calculation strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, applying this knowledge to solve worded problems. They will also solve missing number problems and work on mathematical investigations. Children will also carry out work linked to their enterprise project which will include analysing data, drawing graphs and working out costs and profits.
Science	Children will learn about the human skeleton, muscles and joints and then will also be looking at healthy eating. They will study the 'Eatwell Plate', learning about the different food groups. This links strongly to their DT work this half term.
Computing	Linked to our topic, children will use the internet to research sandwich varieties and compare prices. They will also begin to learn how to use Google Forms to create surveys.
History	Not covered this half term.
Geography	Not covered this half term.
Physical Education	The children will continue to go swimming every week and will develop their swimming skills. Children will also develop their ball skills focusing on throwing, catching, bowling and batting.
Art and Design	Not covered this half term.
Design and Technology	Children will be looking at healthy eating, studying the 'Eatwell Plate' then using their knowledge of this to design and make their own healthy sandwiches which they will sell to the staff. They will learn about the safe and hygienic preparation of foods and will also learn how to slice, spread, chop, grate and peel.
Music	During this half term the children will continue to learn about African Slave songs, they will be given the opportunity to perform
	the songs and create a musical accompaniment, using a range of instruments.
