
Dear Parents and Carers,

It is an honour to announce that on Saturday 26th July, the mum of our former Year 5 pupil: Joshua Hillstead, who tragically lost his life in an accident last Summer, will be launching the Foundation that she has set up in his name. Becky Hinde was determined when she lost Joshua that she would set up a water safety foundation and that's exactly what she has done. Her determination has taken Becky all the way to the Houses of Parliament as she campaigns for compulsory water safety lessons in all schools. As you all know, I made a promise to Becky that we would carry out the Royal Life Saving Society's (RLSS) water safety lessons and, consequently, we have done so this term. We now want to do everything that we can to support the foundation with its launch at Wythall Park. It would be wonderful if the whole school community could get behind this event and go and support the day.
