Parent Information Evenings:

It has been really lovely this week to welcome so many of you in person to our Parent Information sessions that were held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Swimming pool and lessons:

It's fantastic to see the return of the swimming pool, which means that we are again able to provide swimming lessons to all of the children from Years 3-6. As I said last year, and hence the swimming pool's return, children learning to swim is something that we feel passionate about as it is a key life skill that enables our children to be as safe as possible in water. Swimming is a statutory part of the curriculum and to be able to have a pool onsite is a huge plus for our children and school. It is still much better to have a pool on site rather than spend a lot of time on a coach for only a short lesson. This is why we have used a large part of our Sports Premium money to enable us to have this facility again this year and are hopeful that is something that we will be able to do every year. Therefore, please be reassured that we will continue to place learning to swim as a vital part of our PE curriculum and ethos.



<u>Author Thomas Taylor visits The Coppice! Another author will visit next week!</u>

Children in Years 4, 5 and 6 were treated to a visit from Thomas Taylor, author of the acclaimed 'Eerie-on-Sea' series of books. Thomas is visiting a few schools around the country to celebrate the release of his latest book: 'Mermedusa' last week, and we were lucky enough to be one of them!

Thomas gave a captivating assembly: he talked about his journey to become an author and his writing processes; he shared the treasures he had found while beachcombing and talked about how he draws inspiration from found objects; and he completed a live illustration challenge, turning scribbles from Coppice kids into different creatures!

The children represented our school very well, listening intently and asking great questions. We were so thrilled to have been able to welcome Thomas to our school and to showcase our reading culture.

We have plans for more author visits this year, with the next one being Alex Willmore's visit to Year One and Two on Tuesday, which we know the children will be equally enthused about.

A huge thank you goes to Assistant Head: Mr. Laight for organising these inspirational events. Without doubt, they have a huge impact on our children and their desire to be both readers and writers.


