
#### Open mornings - praise for our school!

#### Whole-school poetry unit:

Over the course of the last week or so, the whole school (Nursery through to Year 6) has been enjoying working on a poetry unit based on a wordless picture book: The Tree and The River (pictured below). This book, written by Aaron Becker tracks the evolution of our species – and its toll on the Earth – through the fates of a lone tree and an enduring river. River and Tree bear silent witness over time as people arrive to harness water, wind, and animals; devise technology and transportation; redirect rivers; and reshape the land. It is a visually stunning and powerful book.



All year groups have produced poetry or responses to the book which will be displayed in our Celebration Corridor. The children have absolutely loved this book and there have been some incredible poetry written by your children in response to the book which you will be able to see and read at the upcoming Parent and Carer meetings in November. For now, here is a taster from one of our Year 6 children: William from 6L.

### **Gymnastic success for Arria!**


