'Mile for Mizpah' Fun Run A School Council Fundraiser

As I wrote in this newsletter a couple of weeks ago, our wonderful School Council approached me a while back regarding their desire to hold a 'Fun Run' in order to raise money for children in Zimbabwe. This idea came about following an assembly by Pastor Steve Crosthwaite of Hollywood Christian Life Centre and his Zimbabwean friend: Tapiwa. After lots of hard work, support from Steve and his son: ex-pupil Joshua, the Council are now able to communicate their plan with you:

Did you know that children thousands of miles away in Zimbabwe wear the Coppice uniform? In a special assembly, we learned about Mizpah Primary School—the school we're connected to in Zimbabwe. We found out about some of the challenges the pupils face, like walking long distances to school, sharing porridge with their families so they don't go hungry, and sometimes having lessons outside. They don't always have the resources we use every day at school.

Hearing about their lives made us feel really grateful for what we have, and it inspired us to help make a difference.

As the School Council, we decided to do something meaningful to support the education of our 'Coppice' friends. That's why we've organised the 'Mile for Mizpah' fun run—to raise money for Mizpah Primary School. We believe every child deserves a great education with teachers who care and inspire them, just like we have.

With your help, we hope to raise enough to fund a teacher for their school. The fun run will take place on <u>Monday 9th June</u> on the school field, with the aim of each class running approximately one mile! We'd love as many people as possible to donate - you can give through the Parent Pay, or children can bring in <u>50p to £1</u> for their class teacher on the day. Your child can also wear clothing of their choice for the fun run e.g. sportswear or even fancy dress!

The judges thought that Finley's speech was excellent and that he used the PEE structure very well. They noted how he began his speech with a well-constructed rebuttal thereby demonstrating that he was able to think on his feet. He was also praised for how well he countered the POIs made against him. We are really proud of all four children!
