

The Coppice Whole School Newsletter Friday 24th November 2023

Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope that you have all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children.

Road Safety Focus:

As you will see from the images below, this week was **National Road Safety Week** and, because of this, we delivered Road Safety assemblies and messages to all children in Years 1 to 6. Road safety messages were also given in all Reception classes by the children's Class teachers. Without doubt, road safety is an incredibly important area of personal safety for all children and, therefore, this week was the perfect opportunity to reinforce how we stay safe when we are near roads or crossing them.

We will also be extending the messages that were given into a practical element of road safety training for the children. This means that, next week, all classes in Years 4 to 6 will go out to the front of school with their Teachers and Teaching Assistants (in groups of 10) to look at the possible dangers of crossing the road and also to actually practise crossing the road itself. This will involve using the zebra crossing on Shawhurst Lane before walking to May Lane to practise crossing the road without a fixed crossing point. The group will then walk back and use the zebra crossing one last time. During this safety exercise, the children will also pay particular attention to driveways and side roads. Please be reassured that this activity will be appropriately risk-assessed to ensure the children's safety at all times.

We have decided to go out of school to practise crossing the road with Years 4 to 6 because we allow Year 5 and 6 pupils to walk to and from school themselves with their Parents' and Carers' permission and, obviously, next year, Year 4 pupils will have this opportunity as well when they are in Year 5. This is therefore a good opportunity to have this training before they start to do this.

Reception to Year 3 will still practise the rules of crossing the road in groups, but, due to their age, will actually do this out on the playground rather than on the actual road itself.

I'm sure that you will be pleased to know that, from now on, we are committed to ensuring that this practical training and key safety messages will happen once every year. We would also like you, as Parents and Carers, to reinforce these messages at home and when walking to and from school please.







Nursery Celebration Certificates:

Following on from presenting of celebration certificates to our Reception children last week, this week Mrs. Ashwell and I also presented certificates to our Nursery children. It is always a joy to spend time in the company of our youngest children who are at the start of their educational journey with us. To see their growth in confidence and development over the course of just over half a term is fabulous and shows the impact of what we do here at The Coppice. You can see the names of both the Nursery and Reception children, who won certificates, further on in this newsletter. A huge well done to all of these children who received certificates on this occasion.

Parents' Evening and well done Year 6 guides!

Thank you to all the Parents and Carers who attended our Parents' afternoon and evening on Tuesday this week. I hope that you found your session useful in finding out about how your child is progressing at school and what areas they need to work on in order to progress further. As I said last week, I know that our teachers have really enjoyed talking to you all and see these meetings as extremely valuable.

I'd also like to say a big thank you to our Year 6 guides who collected children and showed Parents and Carers where to go to meet their children for their appointments. We had lots of lovely compliments about them, which is always a great feeling. To quote one Parent who emailed me about one of our Year 6 boys: 'I must say what a lovely, polite and confident young boy he is. A real credit to the school.' As you know, we work incredibly hard at The Coppice to ensure that our children demonstrate these personal qualities when having contact with visitors so it is fantastic when this is recognised.

Everyone, who attended this show, said how amazing it was! 
