Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children.



Our School Council are excited to launch their first project of the year: *Mizpah Smiles*. Over the next couple of weeks, the children are encouraging our school community to donate **small toys, games and craft items** (in good, usable condition) to support pupils at **Mizpah Primary School in Zimbabwe**. This is the school that we have supported previously through fundraising. A project like this helps our pupils develop empathy, kindness and an understanding of how they can make a positive difference to children beyond their own community.

Donations can be brought into school, where members of the School Council will be responsible for collecting and organising them, and putting them into the blue barrel pictured above. Once the barrel is full, it will be collected by Steve Crosthwaite of Hollywood Christian Life Centre and then transported to Zimbabwe. Sending the items in a sealed barrel like this is the cheapest and safest way for these items to be shipped.

Thank you in advance for supporting this meaningful initiative and helping us spread smiles further afield - your donations will truly make many children, who don't have much at all, very happy! If we manage to fill one barrel completely, we will consider taking on a second barrel so please support our wonderful School Council and children of Mizpah Primary School if you can.

Year 2 children are published authors!


