### Children mark David Attenborough's 100th Birthday!

This afternoon, all of our children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 watched a live assembly to celebrate Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday.

The children learnt that in 1976, the BBC began production on David Attenborough's **Life on Earth**. No-one had ever attempted a natural history series on this scale before. It was a wildlife blockbuster: a three-year, hair-raising odyssey around the world, travelling to 40 countries, across a million miles, and filming over 600 species.

Sir David is a 'National Treasure' and it is vital that our children are aware of the incredible legacy that he has created, and also the huge impact that he has had in raising awareness of conservation and environmental change.

Given our focus on careers in the world of science, and the importance of broadening our children's understanding of the impact of human beings on the world, this event was extremely valuable.

David Attenborough's work has significantly shaped how we view and care for the natural world, making this a strong and relevant link for evidencing our PSQM work and inspiring pupils.



## The Big School Workout with Joe Wicks!

Linked to giving our children as many fun, healthy activities to partake in as possible, all classes in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 will be joining Joe Wicks live next Thursday (14th May) as he leads a high-energy workout for children to celebrate Mental Health Awareness Week.

The workout will last for thirty minutes and, because of this, all of the children will be allowed to come in their P.E. kits.

Schools across the country will be taking part together at this event (organised by Picture News), discovering how moving our bodies can boost our mood, build resilience, and support our mental wellbeing.

Nursery and Reception pupils will also have the opportunity to partake in the Joe Wicks event for an age-appropriate amount of time and can wear P.E. kit too.

This should be a really fun event and we are all (including staff) looking forward to it!

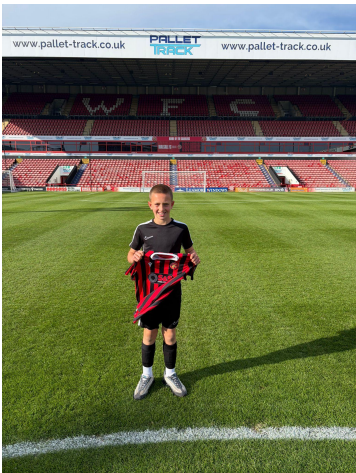
We greatly look forward to seeing you all at this very special event. It's going to be a huge amount of fun so please attend if you can.
