Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children.

Christmas Fayre:

We are really looking forward to seeing you all at our Christmas Fayre this evening and your support will be really appreciated! Please remember that the entrance to the fayre will be via the large gates next to the Woodrush astro pitch (where you enter the site at the end of the school day). The fayre will be in the Infant/Church hall, the Reception and Key Stage One classrooms and the Year 4 classrooms opposite the Care Club Huts. The Care Club huts will be the location for children to see Santa in the grotto. There will be a Christmas market feel with food stalls, a bar, entertainment, games and craft stalls. There will also be the chance to win prizes on the tombola and to see Mr. Lampard, Ms. Croft and our amazing school choir all performing an array of festive songs. The fayre will run from 5.00 pm until 7.30 pm and, as always, I'm certain that a good time will be had by all.

St. Mary's Advent assemblies:

Linked to the above, on Monday, our Christmas preparations began with Gary, from St. Mary's, delivering Advent assemblies to Key Stage One and Key Stage Two pupils. These were lovely occasions and the children engaged with the messages really well. It is so important to us as a school that, whatever their individual beliefs, all of our children understand why we celebrate Christmas and have a sound understanding of the Christmas story. As you know, we are not a church school but we are a school that seeks to give our children many different perspectives so that they can make up their own mind in an informed way. Our much-valued links with St, Mary's are therefore an important part of that ethos.



Sounds Write Information meeting and phonics workshops:

Linked to the above, a big thank you to all of you who attended Mr. Laight's Sounds Write Phonics meeting on Tuesday after school, and also to those of you who have attended the recent phonics workshops hosted in classrooms. I'm sure that you will have found all of these events very useful in finding out how we teach phonics here at The Coppice and how you can support your child with their phonics learning at home. We will continue to hold these very important events over the course of the year so please attend when you can. Helping your child learn to read is one of the best things you will ever do and these events will very much help you learn how you can do that.

Meeting with representatives of The School Council:

It was an absolute pleasure to be able to meet with Tobie-Jai and Alice from The School Council in order for them to feed back to me on what the Council have been discussing recently and for them to ask me questions about areas that are of importance to them. As you will probably know, the Council are responsible for getting the views of all of the children in school so that the children have their voice in areas that directly affect them and that they are passionate about. As you can see from the agenda below, topics discussed were: future organisation of poppy sales and sauces at lunchtime. The big agenda item was the continued development of the playground and what markings, activities and additions the children would like to see now that we have a fantastic 'blank canvas'. I was able to inform them that we are getting a new drone, aerial view of the playground in order to map out these features, which the Council will be involved in – very exciting for us all! Both Tobie-Jai and Alice were a credit to The Council: thoughtful, articulate, respectful and well prepared – well done both of you!



Year 3 Stone Age Day - Primary History Workshop:

As you can see from the montage of photos below, last Friday, the Year 3 children had a wonderful time taking part in many amazing activities during their Stone Age Workshop with Adam and his wonderful team. In the morning, they took part in a hunt, where they learned techniques to capture a woolly mammoth. The children also compared the skulls of homo-sapiens and homo-neanderthals. They also became archaeologists searching for artefacts and then deciding whether they could be from the Stone Age. In the afternoon, they crafted tools using sticks, flint, twine, and feathers. After that, they produced cave paintings and took part in some archery. This excellent day further cemented the children's learning from over the course of the term and, without doubt, they have learnt a huge amount. A big thank you goes to Miss. Keight, Miss. Allen and Mr. Lampard for organising this brilliant day for the children.



Litter picking:

Last week, our School Council went litter picking on the school field. At first, the children didn't think that they would find very much litter on the field as the children at The Coppice are very well trained to put their rubbish in a bin! 
Star of the Week - Hot Chocolate

Have you double checked your Christmas Lunch Bookings?

Christmas Lunch MUST be ordered in advance on Parent Pay. The cut-off date for ordering will be Wednesday 13th December. This is so that the correct amount of food can be ordered and delivered in time for the meal.

Please note that in order to add the Christmas meal option, Parent Pay have removed all meal selections you may have already made in advance. The ONLY meal choice for Wednesday 20th December will be the Christmas lunch. Therefore, if you do not want your child to have the meat or vegetarian meal you will need to bring in a packed lunch for that day. Jacket potatoes, pasta or sandwich options will NOT be available.

<u>Thursday 21st December</u>. The only meal choices which will be available for this day will be sandwich options. This is due to the kitchen cooking Christmas lunch for the whole staff. If you have already booked a hot meal in advance you will need to select a cold food option. Parent Pay have removed all other selections from the day's choices so you will need to go to Parent Pay and rebook with the new choices.
