Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you've all had a good week and, as always, are looking forward to the weekend with your children. I just want to say a huge thank you to all of the parents and carers who have said congratulations to me this week after the birth of our son: Bobby and who have also asked how my wife is doing. It really means a lot that so many of you have done this and sums up again that, at The Coppice, we have a unique family feel where everyone cares about each other, whether you are a parent, carer or member of staff.

Meet the new teacher sessions:

Hopefully you will all have received the communication that I sent out earlier in the week to let you know who your child's new teacher will be for the next academic year. Just to remind you all that your child will have an opportunity to meet them on Wednesday 13th July at 10.30 am. This session will be an hour long and will provide a really good opportunity for your child to find out a bit about their new teacher and some information about what their learning will be for next year. The beauty of having these sites is that it means information can we watched and re-watched if necessary at any point before September. This ensures that nothing is forgotten.

On Wednesday evening, I had the pleasure of being at our school's Summer Music Concert. I have to say, as I did to the parents and carers who came to watch their children perform, that I was completely wowed by the children who performed and, as Headteacher, I was filled with pride. 
