Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you've all had a good week, have managed to cope well with the excessive heat that we have been experiencing and that all of your friends and relatives have managed to stay safe and well. Obviously, we have reached the end of the current academic year (I can't quite believe it if I'm honest) and I know that many of you will be looking forward to a break from routine and to spending extra time with friends and family. It's been a fantastic year and I know you'll agree with me when I say that it's felt amazing to have a full year of school again without disruption. To be able to do all the usual school activities: assemblies, trips, sporting events, concerts, fairs, and productions has been wonderful. Most importantly, the children have embraced this return and have achieved so much – we are extremely proud of them all.

It's been a very busy last week and a half at The Coppice but it has been a joyous time with lots to talk about and lots to celebrate:

Goodbye, good luck and well done Year 6!

Everyone at The Coppice wants to wish our Year 6 pupils all the very best for the future as they prepare to transition to their respective high schools. It has been an absolute pleasure to be in the hall this week, watching their fantastic leavers' productions and celebrating their time with us. We are extremely proud of these children for what they have accomplished, especially due to the fact that they had to return to school after two years of disruption due to the pandemic and then had to face their SATs tests. Despite this, their attitude has been first class and we couldn't have asked for any more from them. We know that these children will go on to achieve great things in the future and we can't wait to see them again in the future and to find out how they are getting on. As someone once said, 'Once a Coppice kid, always a Coppice kid'! It is also the end of an association with the school for a number of our families as they will no longer have a child at the school. I want to thank all of them for their support of their children and the school over the years and, as with the children, we want to say that it will be great to see them all again at some point in the future.

SAT results:

I mentioned our Year 6 SAT results above so now is a good time to tell you what our results were. The first figure mentioned is the Coppice figure and the figure in brackets is the national average figure.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: **80%** (72%) Above expected standard: 33%

Reading: **79%** (74%) Above expected standard: 33%

Maths: **76%** (71%) Above expected standard: 33%

Writing (teacher assessed): **78%** (69%) Above expected standard:28%

We are rightly very proud of these results and I want to thank the children again for their fantastic attitude in achieving them and to the Year 6 staff for their hard work and dedication in enabling the children to achieve what they have after such challenging circumstances. I also want to praise all of the school staff who have been part of these children's educational journey along the way. Children's successes are never just down to one year group but are due to one, big team effort. Well done everyone!

School reports:

All children from Years 1-6 received their school reports on Monday of this week. It was an absolute pleasure to read these reports and to see how well the children have progressed this year. If for some reason, you have not received your child's report e.g. due to absence, please make sure that you contact your child's teacher and they will make sure that they get it to you as soon as possible, via post if necessary.

Celebration assemblies:

We have held our final round of celebration assemblies this week and Mrs. Ashwell and I have been busy presenting certificates to all year groups from Nursery through to Year 5. Obviously, Year 6 were celebrated during their Leavers' assemblies, as mentioned above. Celebration assemblies are always lovely occasions and it has been great to end the year with so much to celebrate in every year group.

Coppice Gymnastic Competitions:

I want to say a huge well done to all of The Coppice gymnasts who competed in the two competitions that we held over the course of the last two weeks. These competitions are extremely important because they give an opportunity for all of the gymnasts in school, from the very youngest and least experienced to the oldest and most experienced, a chance to compete in front of peers, friends and families. This is a huge moment for a number of these children and is another confidence building block for them. It takes a lot of courage to walk out in front of a crowd and perform an individual or group routine so I want to say a huge well done to every child who took part – you can all be very proud of yourselves. Thank you and well done also to Miss. Carter and the rest of The Coppice coaches for their efforts in organising these competitions and for their hard work with all of the children throughout the year. We truly are lucky to have such dedicated staff.

Cricket reward trip:

As a reward for their commitment to Physical education and how they exhibited The Coppice Way when doing so, Miss. Wells and Mr. Edwards took a group of children to Worcestershire County Cricket Club to watch a 50 overs game between the South Africa and England Lions' Academy Teams. South Africa bowled first and England fielded. The bowling and fielding were amazing to watch! Despite the heat, the children really got into the game and cheered on both teams. After lunch, the 'Activation Area' was open. This was a place where some of the cricket players from Worcestershire County Cricket Club helped the children with cricket skills such as batting and bowling. Cool Milk

If you would like to register your child to receive school milk in the next academic year you can register safely, online and they can enjoy school milk for around £16 per term. Simply visit www.coolmilk.com, and select 'register my child for school milk'.

If your child already enjoys school milk then there is no need to re-register just pay as usual.

If you are in receipt of means tested Free School Meals (not KS1 Universal Free School Meals) you can get your milk for free. Just register and tell them they are FSM, they will check with school and then you will get your milk paid for. If your child is under 5 years they will receive their milk free of charge until their 5th birthday. You do still need to register them though. On the approach to their 5th birthday CoolMilk will contact you to ask if you wish to continue or not.

The free activities are funded by the Department for Education (DfE) for children who receive free school meals (FSM) or children who have been referred to the HAF programme by professionals.

If eligible, your account will be automatically credited with 16 free passes per child on sign up. You can browse activities by map, calendar, or list.

All activity clubs are inclusive of Children with SEND and you are welcome to book any of our mainstream activity days. Please take care on sign up to provide as much information about your child to providers – it's important that they have this in order to best support and safeguard your child. We do also have some specialised SEND clubs on offer, these are run by providers with specialist facilities, training or adapted activities. To find these, type 'SEND' into the keyword search.
