Dear Parents and Carers,,

I hope that you have all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children. It has been really lovely this week to welcome so many of you in person to our Parent Information sessions that were held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. To have parents entering our school building again has been a great feeling and I know that those of you who have attended have felt the same way. It has also been fabulous to show-off our new library area and Nursery refurbishment and to see how impressed you've been with what we have created. I sincerely hope that the information that you have received has been very useful and informative as this is what we want it to be. Should anything remain unclear though, please don't hesitate to contact your child's Class Teacher.

We do appreciate that not all of you were able to attend these meetings in person. However, it is vital to us that you still receive the information that was shared. Therefore, in order to help everyone to either access the information again, or to receive it for the first time, we have uploaded the Year Group presentations into the Year group newsletters area on the school website. Each presentation will sit alongside this week's Year Group newsletter.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, our teachers have been working very hard with your children to establish a culture of exemplary behaviour in our school. Many of you will know by now that we are calling our approach to this aim 'The Coppice Way'.

'The Coppice Way' is a behaviour curriculum that our Senior Leadership Team: Mrs. Ashwell, Mr. Laight and I have designed to teach children the rules, routines and habits that will ensure our school is a place where everyone can thrive. We believe that children need to be taught and not just told how to behave. Our behaviour lessons formed the basis of the first week of school and gave detailed expectations for how children should behave in different situations around school. Please see overleaf for our one-page, 'stick-on-the-fridge', printable pull-out of 'The Coppice Way' lessons that were taught, our whole-school rules and memorable acronyms that we are using in school every day.

We have endeavoured to make our school a place where it is easy for the children to behave and hard not to. The Teacher Education Day at the start of term was used by the Senior Leadership Team to train all school staff working directly with children: Teachers, Teaching Assistants, Special Support Assistants and Lunchtime Supervisors, in key principles and strategies of our approach to both the teaching and managing of behaviour. This was incredibly well received by all staff and we are grateful for the energy and effort that they have put into implementing 'The Coppice Way' with the children.

Furthermore, our Senior Leaders and me have been thrilled with the way the children have engaged with 'The Coppice Way'. From greeting the children on the school gate and our regular walks around school every day over the last two weeks, it is clear that the children have been putting their learning into action. For example, we've been practising a routine of meeting and greeting which we call GLASS greetings (see over page) and we are delighted with the number of children for whom this is becoming a habit. We know that many of you have noticed and commented upon how your child has shared this learning with you. We are really grateful for the very positive feedback we've received so far. Your support in reinforcing our behaviour ethos is immensely valuable in helping to ensure its success so we thank you for this.

We all think extremely highly of our Coppice children and believe that our behaviour culture in school can be exemplary. We feel we've made a really good start with this and we're excited to reinforce and develop this work over the coming weeks, months and years.

Finally, I want to end by saying what a joy it has been for Mrs. Ashwell and me to meet our 'Stars Of The Week' from last week for a cup of hot chocolate in the staffroom this afternoon. This will be a regular feature of the end to our week in school and I know that everyone will love sharing this special time

That just leaves me, as always to say that I hope you have both a restful and enjoyable weekend and we look forward to seeing you all on Monday.
